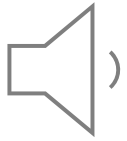

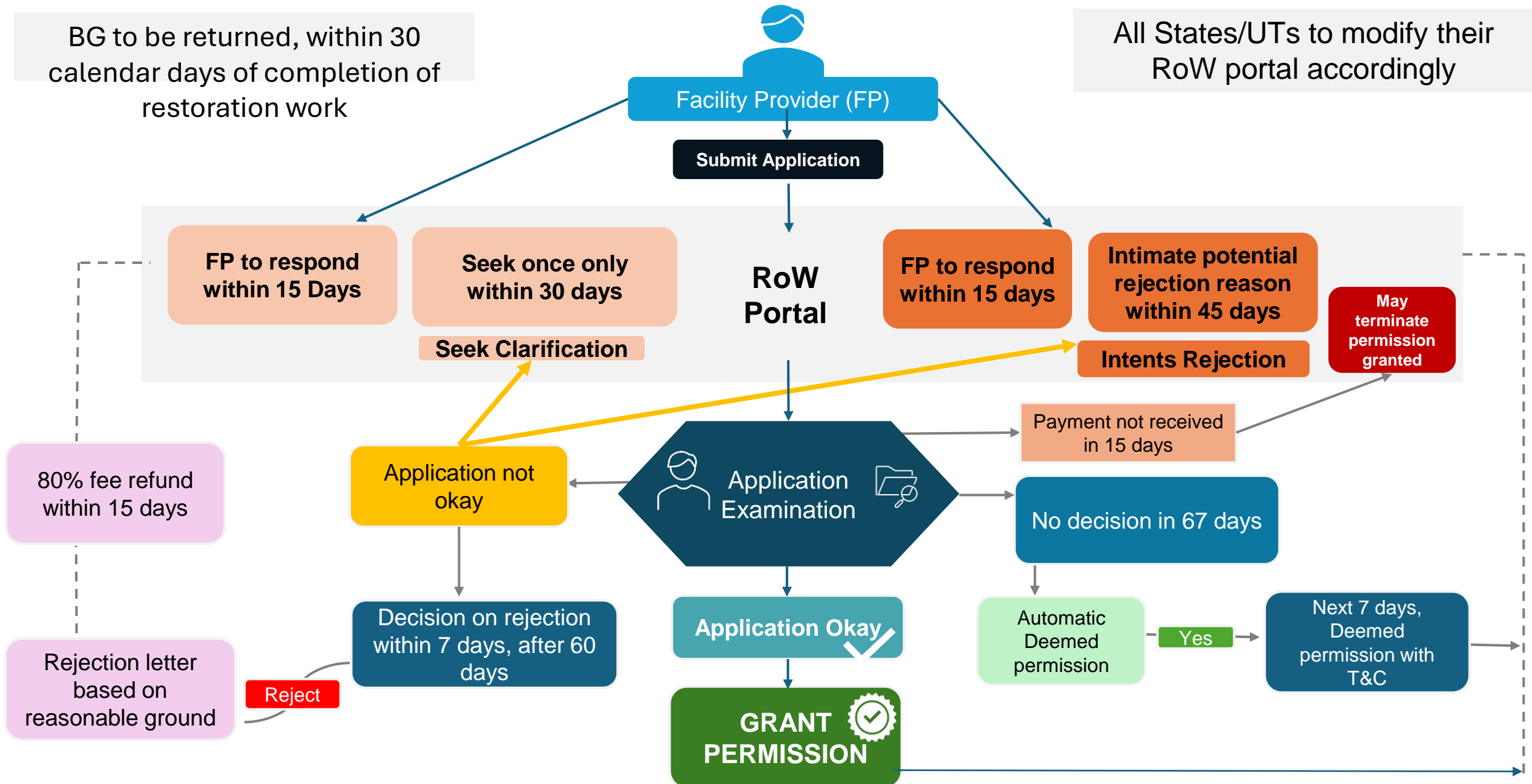

Establishment of Telecom infrastructure on Private Property. :-

- No Permission required for private property
- Only Intimation required for Private Property (Structure Suitability required)

1. Validity of permission co-terminus with the Telecom authorization

2. Establishment/ maintenance of Telecommunication Network on Public Property

- Case of damage to any existing underground telecommunication network operated and maintained by a FP.
- FP may temporarily establish overground telecommunication network on the public property, for prompt restoration. No fee or compensation to be charged
- FP to intimate details of damage, through the portal, to the relevant public entity.
- FP to restore underground telecommunication network within sixty calendar days from the date of reporting

3. RoW on Private property - If no mutual agreement

- **Regarding permission - District Collector** or other designated officer as notified by the Central Govt. to take administrative decision within 60 calendar days.
- **Regarding compensation – District Judge**

1. **Removal, relocation or alteration** of the overground or underground telecom network.

- FP may do as per request, but the Public entity **shall defray such expenses from the compensation, if any,** received from the FP

2. If **Private property owner wants to use his property which may cause damage, interruption or interfere with telecom n/w**

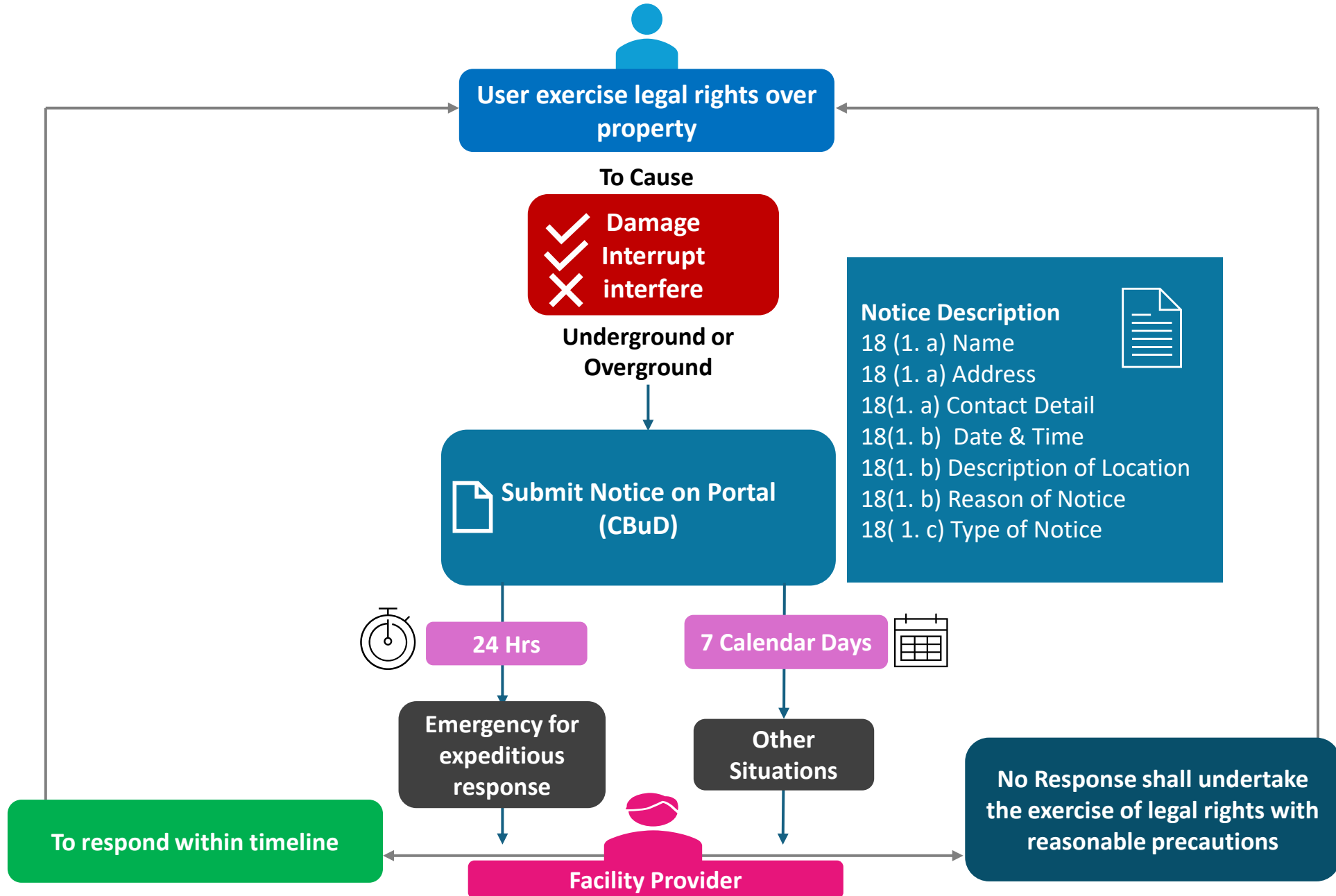
- Property owners to give prior notice

A) For Dispute resolution – District collector may take remedial action :

- i. Order such person to abstain from dealing with such property for up to 1 month or
- ii. Forthwith take such action as may be necessary to prevent damage, interruption, interference to the telecommunication network

B) Any dispute in relation to compensation or damages - District Judge

Common ducts and Cable corridors

- Central Govt may notify infrastructure projects, or class of infra projects whether by public entity by itself or through PPP or by any other person that may require establishment of common ducts or conduits or cable corridors for installation of telecom n/w – promoting open access for FPs
- Tariff to be based on prevailing market rates and based on the principle of cost recovery over a minimum period of 25 years

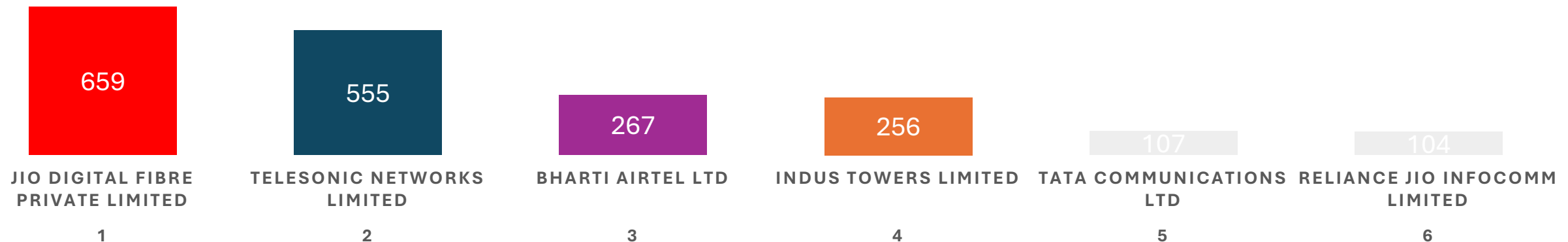

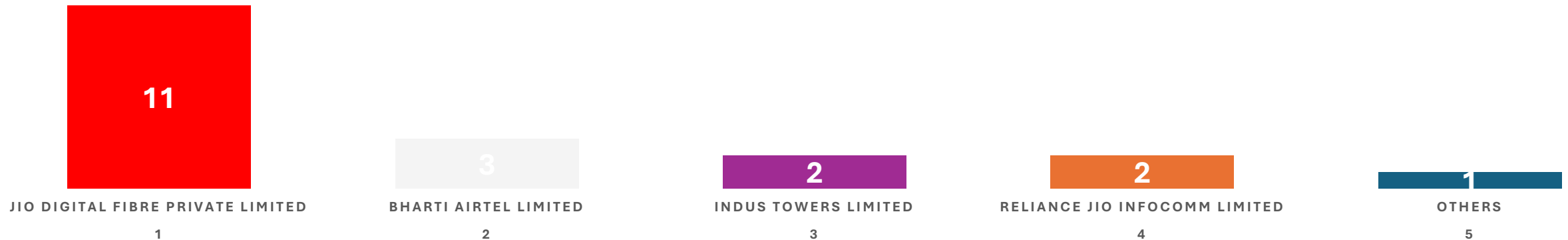

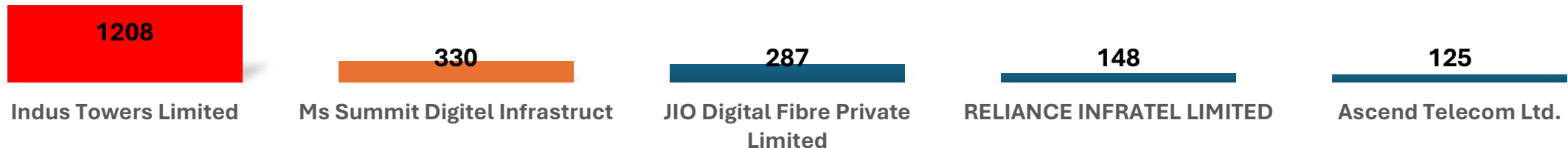
